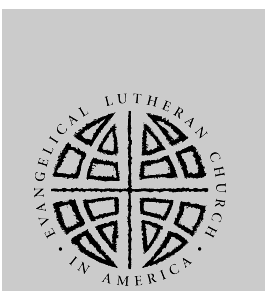
A Note from Pastor Justin:

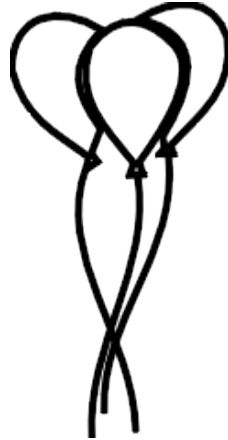

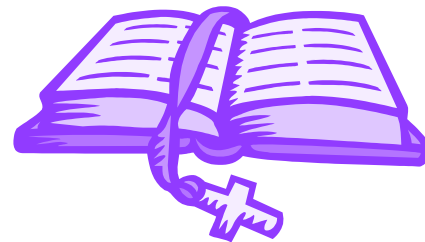

Hospitality or Hospitality-tea

One of my Spiritual Gifts relates to Hospitality. When you think of hospitality, a fine china tea cup, linen napkins, and fancy tea cakes garnished with fresh flowers might first come to mind. Hosting such an elegant affair is certainly hospitable, however I think Jesus may put in a slightly different twist. I believe extending one's self to accommodate another is a start, but I also believe that going beyond the realm of favoring your friends and neighbors gets slightly closer to what Jesus had in mind.

I have recently been the recipient of hospitality this past month while I was out of town. I had casually met my friend's parents once, but as I traveled away from my home to attend a conference that happened to be near their home, my friend's parents made accommodations for me that were not necessary. Only having met them once some time ago, they went out of their way to offer comforts while I was so far from home. They offered directions to places of interest, including church; met me at church where I was included in their routine, and escorted me back to their home for a lovely dinner, conversation and fellowship with more of their family. I was made to feel like family by a family I had barely known. Now, this doesn't quite compare to the "Good Samaritan" story, but in today's world was close. How many times do we have opportunities to serve, welcome and accommodate others that pass us by?

I am reminded of a friend who was at a walk in clinic with her sick child. A young mother came in with her baby who was obviously feverish and quite ill. The young mother was attempting to check in when she was informed that if she didn't have cash she could not be seen. The receptionist was curt and without compassion. My friend could have easily paid for that visit, but she just watched with disbelief at the rude and gruff way the receptionist treated the young mother. As the mother left, my friend realized the missed opportunity. As she rose and went after the young mother, she realized that the old rusty car was already chugging away. Caught up in her anger at the actions of the receptionist, she missed her own opportunity at hospitality. Jesus calls us to hospitality, not only to those who we feel are deserving, but also to our enemies. He calls us to put ourselves aside in humble service to others. Without putting ourselves into direct danger, and using sound judgment, we are called to step into places where we are stretched to service. It is easy to be using our gifts and talents where we have made the decision who should receive, but let us follow God's lead to service. As we move through our busy lives, let us try and be mindful of opportunities that are presenting themselves.

Church Council

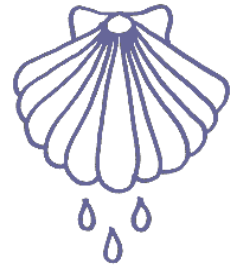
